**Writ of Confiscation**

**Ashfield, Vincent Pierce**

Monmouth County, to wit:

The State of New Jersey to John Stillwill Esq. Agent, duly appointed for the said county on the part and behalf of said state to take and dispose of for the use and benefit of the same the estates of certain fugitives and offenders in the said county, greeting.

Whereas lately, that is to say of the term of June in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine, in the court of Common Pleas, held at Newark in and for the County of Essex, before the judges of the same court, final judgment was held and entered in favor of the said state of New Jersey pursuant to the Law against Vincent Pierce Ashfield late of the afsd. County of Essex, on an Inquisition found against the said Vincent Pierce Ashfield, for joining the Army of the King of Great Britain and otherwise offending against the form of his Allegiance to the said state, and returned to the said court as may fully appear of record. You are therefore commanded and enjoined to sell and dispose of all the Estate, Real of what nature or kind soever belonging, or lately belonging, to the said Vincent Pierce Ashfield within the said county of Monmouth, according to the Directions of an Act for Forfeiting to and Vesting in the State of New Jersey, the Real Estates of Certain Fugitives and Offenders, made and passed the eleventh day of December, in the year of our Lord, one thousand seven hundred and seventy-eight.
