1	For the National Child Labor Committee, photographer Lewis W. Hine documented New Jersey children employed at glassware factories, farms, and other workplaces.	
2	Before the <i>Titanic</i> sank in 1912 after hitting an iceberg, Ida Straus refused to board a lifeboat and leave her husband Isidor behind.	
3	Citing NJ's Civil Rights Act of 1884 that barred racial discrimination in public places, black photographer A.T. Moore sued a theater in New Brunswick in 1911.	
4	Years before the U.S. airmail service was formally established, pilot Oliver Simmons flew a bag of mail from Perth Amboy to South Amboy in 1912.	
5	In 1912, New Jersey Governor and Presidential candidate Woodrow Wilson summered with his family in Sea Girt and attended the Monmouth County Fair.	
6	The Monmouth County Archives holds WWI-era bottler registrations for dairies such as that of Melvin A. Rice's Drynoch Farm in the Leonardo section of Middletown.	
7	During the Paterson Silk Strike in 1913, thousands of workers gathered in front of silk weaver Pietro Botto's house in Haledon.	
8	Woodrow Wilson Hall at Monmouth University was known as Shadow Lawn in 1916 when Wilson used it as the Summer White House.	
9	In the 1910s, Fort Lee preceded Hollywood as the national center for silent film production.	
10	Largely as a result of WWI, inflation in the U.S. rose to more than 17% in 1917.	
11	In New Jersey during WWI, the facilities later renamed Fort Dix and Fort Monmouth were both created.	
12	The Sigmund Eisner Co. in Red Bank, a major manufacturer of military uniforms, made an overcoat for General Pershing, commander of U.S. forces in Europe.	
13	In 1916, sabotage destroyed the Black Tom munitions shipping depot in Jersey City.	
14	African American army units in WWI included many troops from New Jersey such as Thomas Weeden of Keyport.	
15	In August 1917, more than 9,000 New Jersey National Guardsmen were sent from Sea Girt to Alabama, where most of them were assigned to the Twenty-ninth Division.	
16	The Monmouth County Board of Chosen Freeholders budgeted for military burials in 1918 and 1919, according to minute books in the Monmouth County Archives.	
17	One of the most popular wartime songs of the WWI era was "Over There" by George M. Cohan.	
18	Activists like Alice Paul of Moorestown advocated suffrage for women until the 19 th Amendment, passed by Congress on June 4, 1919, gave women the right to vote.	
19	More than 4,000 people in New Jersey died from the Influenza Pandemic in September and October 1918.	
20	During the Red Scare in late 1919 and early 1920, more than 10,000 were arrested nationwide, including in New Jersey, and more than 500 aliens were deported.
