2018 New Jersey History Game: Buildings in Monmouth

1	The Hall of Records in Freehold is on the site of the first county courthouse built in 1715.	
2	Built in 1846, the African Methodist Episcopal Church is the earliest remaining house of worship in Eatontown.	
3	Completed by 1914, The Monmouth Beach Bath & Tennis Club is the only intact pre-1930 bath clubhouse remaining along the county's coast.	
4	Cornelius Van Couwenhoven, who purchased land in what is now Holmdel with three other Dutch families, built the oldest section of his still extant house in about 1700.	
5	Although Derrick Longstreet was of Dutch descent on his paternal side, his Boxwood Cottage, built in the early 19 th century in Brielle, is in the English style.	
6	The Joseph B. Bailey trade shop in Keyport is one of the best remaining examples of a small 19 th century workman's shop in Monmouth County.	
7	The current Friends Meeting House in Shrewsbury was completed in 1816, using bricks from its predecessor to reinforce the frame structure's walls.	
8	The 1870s Jane Oakes House in Little Silver, constructed in the Second Empire style, was recently restored using original building plans on file in the Monmouth County Archives.	
9	At the John Burrowes House in Matawan in 1778, a Tory raiding party almost captured patriot officer John Burrowes Jr., who later became Sheriff of Monmouth County.	
10	When it opened in 1894, the Ocean Grove Auditorium had a total seating capacity of 9,600, including folding chairs.	
11	Dedicated in 1912, The Preventorium in Howell provided a healthy environment for urban children at risk for developing tuberculosis.	
12	Architect Charles A. Rich, who designed buildings for Dartmouth and Smith colleges, prepared the plan for the Colonial Revival home of stage director Julian Mitchell in West Long Branch.	
13	The octagon schoolhouse in East Branch, demolished in 1940, was one of only two in Monmouth County that was built according to a 1773 Bucks County Quaker design.	
14	Joshua Huddy fired guns from the windows of his Colts Neck home during a 1780 attack by Loyalist "refugees" led by escaped slave Colonel Tye.	
15	"Maple Hall" was the name African American author and journalist T. Thomas Fortune called his Red Bank house, to which he moved in 1901.	
16	Seven Presidents Park is now the site of "The Navaho," the last surviving building on The Reservation, a community built in the early 1900s by Buffalo Bill's partner, Nathan Salsbury.	
17	At Walnford in Upper Freehold in the 1770s, the mills and farm supported Richard Waln's international trade, providing commodities such as lumber, flour, and woolen cloth.	
18	Much of the unincorporated community of Shark River Hills in Neptune Township is on 700 acres purchased by the Board of Chosen Freeholders for the County Poor Farm.	
19	Although built in 1751, Old Tennent Church did not get its current name officially until 1920.	
20	Completed in 1907, St. Catharine Church in Spring Lake was built as a memorial to benefactor Martin Maloney's recently deceased young daughter Catharine.	
21	Opened in 1887, the financially troubled Asbury Park Grand Opera House on Emory Avenue was destroyed by fire in 1900.	
22	Dr. Robert W. Cooke's Holmdel office, built in the Federal style in 1823, may be the oldest extant doctor's office in the United States.	
23	Built in 1927, the Dexter Blagden House in Middletown became the mansion of the wealthy stockbroker's widow, the former Mabel Whitney, a birth control pioneer.	
24	Used by General Charles Lee after the Battle of Monmouth, the Village Inn in Englishtown was operated by a series of private owners for well over 200 years.	
25	William Augustus Street's house in Rumson is the only one in the region that maintains the integrity of its original design by the renowned architectural firm McKim, Mead and White.
